



## The Changing Role of Schools

It is very interesting to note how schools have changed over the years particularly in terms of what they offer in the classroom and also how children are expected to assimilate information and learn.

There is no area of the school where the change has been greater than in the Early Years classrooms (Pre-school and Reception).

In the 'old days', education for children generally began at the age of 5 and very little was on offer for children below this age.

If a school provided education for children aged 3 to 5 years, it was generally just a watered down version of what happened in older classrooms.

This meant that, from a very young age, children were seated in a formal traditional manner in rows, all facing the front and learning was regarded as the ability to retain and regurgitate facts.

Research into the way in which children learn recognised that this was neither the best way to teach young children, nor did it suit the learning styles of the majority.

In the early 1990s, a radical shift took place in the UK and the National Curriculum developed a specialist syllabus for young children called the Early Years Curriculum.

This programme was developed to take account of the fact that children of this age learn best through play and first-hand experience.

By giving young children a diet of planned experiences through areas of learning, they develop the skills to become much better learners as they move through the school.
